

Still Have **Asthma Symptoms,** Even With Medication?

Consider participating in a
clinical research study.

The **Palladium Study** is a clinical research study testing an investigational asthma medication. The study is evaluating whether it is safe and effective for people with asthma who still have symptoms, even when treated with asthma medication.

You may qualify if you:

- Are 12 years or older (age eligibility depends on your country's participation)
- Have been diagnosed with asthma for at least a year
- Currently take inhaled medication for asthma
- Still experience asthma symptoms (wheezing, shortness of breath, chest tightness, coughing)

Eligible participants will be asked to join an asthma study to test a new once daily inhaler.

The study is evaluating the effectiveness of a once daily inhaler treatment as compared to twice daily inhaler treatment.

Study duration:

Approximately 14 months
