If chronic rhinosinusitis with nasal polyposis (CRSwNP) is causing loss of smell, congestion, runny nose, or facial pain/pressure, you may want to consider a clinical study for adults 18 to 70 years of age.

Ask your doctor about the ECLIPSE study.



The purpose of this clinical trial is to test the safety and effectiveness of the study drug, etokimab.

The study medication will be given by subcutaneous injection just under the skin into a layer of body fat (the tummy or upper arms) every 4 weeks.

To be eligible for this study, you must:

- Be 18 to 70 years of age
- Have nasal polyps in both nostrils
- Have at least 2 of the following symptoms:
 - Nasal blockade/obstruction
 - Nasal congestion
 - Nasal discharge (anterior/posterior nasal drip)
 - Facial pain/pressure
 - Reduction or loss of smell
- Be a non-smoker or have quit smoking at least 6 months ago
- Sign the informed consent form (ICF)

This is not a complete list of eligibility criteria. Your doctor will review your eligibility with you.

All study-related visits, tests, and procedures will be provided and you will be reimbursed for reasonable and acceptable study-related travel costs.
